Is the English language decaying or diversifying? Should we be celebrating diversity within our accents or conforming to a prescriptive norm? These were some of the questions posed by Rob Drummond, senior lecturer in the Department of Languages at Manchester Metropolitan University, Head of Youth Languages and founder of the UrBEn-ID project, during his time with Year 12 and Year 13 A-Level Language students. The respected linguist spoke to students from a number of local schools about the way in which our language is intrinsically associated with our identity. Students ended the intensive revision day feeling well-informed and inspired by Rob and his “vanilla” accent.

On Wednesday, five language students from Year 12 visited Strasbourg to experience a day in the life of an MEP in the European Parliament. The students won a place on the prestigious trip after making an informative multi-lingual rap to the tune of 'In My Feelings' by Drake, and a well done goes to Josh Dixon for leading his team to victory. At the EU Parliament, students sat in the seats of real MEPs, listened to speakers of different languages and voted in polls. German! In the afternoon, the students had to make their own teams of students of different nationalities and answer questions from all 24 languages from EU member states. Later, the students formed smaller groups to discuss the topic of immigration. Well done to Abid Choudhury for leading the debate for our team!

'The cost of a plastic bottle is too great' – join us to discuss and debate single-use plastic




