This competition involved Year 8 and 9 students from the North East, North West, Yorkshire and the Humber. Both girls performed brilliantly, translating an impressive number of sentences in just one minute from English into French and in three different tenses. Catherine achieved third place overall, and has won a place in the national final. She will join Jedidah Ohiomokhare, our third-place winner in the recent Spelling Bee regional final, who is also heading to the national final in Cambridge in July.
