Dear Parents and Carers

I am writing to share with you the arrangements for the Year 11 assessments that are scheduled to take place from Monday 17 May to Wednesday 26 May inclusive. You will find a copy of the timetable at the end of this email. The timetable has also been published to ITS Learning and the parent portal.

Full attendance is expected and required to ensure we have the evidence to complete the grading process, and we ask you not to book any medical or other routine appointments during this period. These assessments will form an important part of our evidence and their completion is, therefore, in the best interests of each student and I would hope that we have full attendance throughout. Thursday 27 May will be the final day that students will be expected to attend school, although students should be available to attend school until Friday 18 June.

The assessments will take place in the sports hall under formal examination conditions. Students must ensure that, when taking an assessment, they do not use any unauthorised materials such as a mobile phone, smart watch or notes. Students will be reminded to place these materials in their bag at the start of their assessments. Students should only have on their desk a see-through pencil case containing their equipment and a clear water bottle (with the label removed if necessary).

Students should continue to work hard and prepare fully for these assessments, as they would do in a normal examination year. I would expect students to be spending 1 to 2 hours per day revising at home. There are videos on the ITS Learning Careers and Apprenticeships page that provide helpful advice on how to revise. If there is anything that students are unsure of, they should ask their teachers in the first instance.

Our students have been preparing extremely well at school as a year group and these final assessments should be an opportunity for everyone to show what they can do. I wish them all the best and, following this period, hope that they fully enjoy the long summer break.
