



Year 7 Annual Exam for Geography

The Geography end of year exam will be divided into four sections:

Section 1: Vocabulary power: you will be given 10 definitions and you will have to identify the correct key word. There will be a choice of key words at the bottom of the page.

Section 2: Knowledge-based questions: you will answer knowledge-based questions worth 25 marks which may require short answers. For example, you may be asked to describe the examples of regeneration from photograph.

Section 3: Extended writing: you will answer two essay questions on topics you have studied this year. There are 3 marks available on this question for spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Section 4: Skills-based questions: you will answer various questions which relate to Geographical skills. For example, you could be asked to interpret data from a graph. *You will need have a calculator, ruler and pencil for this section.*

The following is a list of suggested revision activities:

1. Create flash cards using the 'our island home' knowledge organiser 1.	What are the main continents and oceans which make up our world? Why is the UK home to deciduous forests? How diverse is our island home's population? What challenges does Newcastle face? Why are we experiencing counter-urbanisation? Is the UK self-sufficient in terms of its food production? Why is the UK a superpower?	
2. Create a mind-map using the exploring 'our local environment' knowledge organiser 2.	How can we understand our place in the world using longitude and latitude? How can maps help us explore our local environment? Where is Emmanuel College on a local, national and global scale? How can we use map symbols and grid references to understand our local environment? Is all of the North-East the same height? How can we use distance to decide whether a journey is too far to walk or not? What is the role of a town planner?	
3. Create a revision poster using weather and climate knowledge organiser 3.	What is the difference between the climate and weather? What are microclimates? What global and local factors affect our climate? Is all rainfall the same? How is the climate changing and what impact does this have? How did Storm Arwen affect us locally?	
4. Write answers to the key questions in the next column using knowledge organiser 4 on coastal environments.	What are the key characteristics of different waves? What factors affect the power of the waves? What are the main coastal processes of erosion, deposition and transportation? How are caves, arches, stacks and stumps formed? How can we protect and regenerate the coast? What are the global risks of rising sea levels?
