



# Year 7 Annual Exam for Spanish

The Spanish end of year exam will be divided into three papers:

## Paper 1: Writing Assessment

Section A: You will have 4 short sentences to translate into Spanish. This will test your understanding of vocabulary, the present tense and adjective agreement.

Section B: You will be given 4 bullet points talking about yourself, your school, your free time and where you live. This will test your knowledge of vocabulary, the present tense, word order, adjective agreement, and opinions. (30 minutes)

## Paper 2: Listening Assessment

You will have 6 questions to answer the following topics: Module 1: my life, Module 2: Free time, Module 3: my school, Module 4: my family and friends and Module 5: my city. You will be given the following question types: multiple choice, answer in English, and phonics. (45 minutes)

## Paper 3: Reading Assessment

You will have 5 questions to answer the following topics: Module 1: my life, Module 2: Free time, Module 3: my school, Module 4: my family and friends and Module 5: my city. You will be given the following question types: multiple choice, gap fill, and translation into English. (30 minutes)
