| 3 | Introduction to Islam <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will explore foundational Islamic beliefs found in the Qur'an and Sunnah, including what Muslims believe about divinity and salvation. | You will make connections to the story of Abraham and see how it is the foundation to Islam as well as Judaism. | 4 | The Incarnation of Jesus <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will explain the concept of the Incarnation of Jesus as presented in the Biblical narrative. You will consider how Old Testament promises are fulfilled in the New Testament. | You will see how God's covenant with Abraham and David are fulfilled in the birth of Christ. | 5 | Islamic Practices <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will explore key Islamic practices including the 5 Pillars. | You will build on your knowledge of how Muslims put their beliefs into practice and the meaning of the faith for modern Muslims. | 6 | Jesus' Teachings <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will explore Jesus' teachings on ethics and salvation. | You will see how Jesus' teaching transformed western ethics laying a foundation for further ethical study. | 7 | Jesus' death, resurrection and return <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will explore the key events of 'Holy week' leading to Jesus' death and investigate different 'truth claims' as to what happened to His body. You will analyse the Christian belief in the resurrection and implications for Christians today | You will build on your analytical skills from your year 7 study of the beginning of the universe. This half-term you will learn how the Genesis narrative is connected to the historic events described in the bible about the crucifixion of Jesus. | 8 | Christian Practices <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will understand what the church is and what happens when the church meets. You will explain the sacraments and the factors leading to the development of denominations | You will build and develop your understanding of Christian Practice, focussing on the nature of the Church and the covenant relationship with God.
